CITY ORDINANCE NO. 4955

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, NEZ PERCE COUNTY, IDAHO, ORDERING A SPECIAL BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE CITY IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$22,540,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING IMPROVEMENTS TO WASTEWATER, WATER, STORMWATER AND ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE AND RELATED IMPROVEMENTS AND COSTS; ESTABLISHING THE DATE AND TIME OF THE SPECIAL BOND ELECTION; APPROVING A FORM OF BALLOT; PROVIDING FOR REGISTRATION OF VOTERS; PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City of Lewiston, Nez Perce County, Idaho (the “City”), is a municipal corporation duly organized and operating under the laws of the state of Idaho; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council (the “Council”) of the City have determined that the interests of the City and the public interest and necessity require the incurring of an indebtedness of the City in the amount not to exceed \$22,540,000 to finance the cost of the providing for wastewater, water, stormwater, and road improvements, together with related improvements and costs; and

WHEREAS, the proposed indebtedness would exceed the City’s income and general obligation provided for the current fiscal year, and the Council has determined that the necessary funds should be raised through the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of the City, subject to the approval of two-thirds (2/3) of the qualified electors voting at the election called for that purpose as provided herein below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, Nez Perce County, Idaho, as follows:

SECTION 1: THE PROJECT

A. The Mayor and Council hereby find, determine, and declare that the interest of the City and the public interest and necessity require the incurring of an indebtedness exceeding the income and general obligation provided to the City for the current fiscal year in an amount not to exceed \$22,540,000 for the purpose of reconstruction of the infrastructure on downtown streets, which is spurred by aging, failing, and undersized underground utilities. Tearing up the deep underground utilities destroys much of the above ground streetscape. Rather than patching the streetscape back, the City is seeking to improve wastewater, water, stormwater, and roads all at once seamlessly and cost-effectively to meet the current and future desires of the community. Downtown businesses are struggling and there is a desire to have the infrastructure better support business, draw people downtown, and spur investment. Also, improving major transportation corridors has long been a priority for the community, with Main Street consistently ranked at the top, together with related improvements, professional services, and related costs (the “Project”).

B. The costs and expenses of the Project are estimated to be \$33,300,000, including the payment of all preliminary expenses incurred and incident to the Project and properly incident to the issuance of the bonds as such expenses are set forth in Idaho Code Sections 50-1019 through 50-1026, all of which shall be payable from the proceeds of the sale of general obligation bonds of the City as provided herein.

C. Subject to the approval thereof by the City Council and by the qualified electors voting at the election for which provision is hereinafter made, general obligation bonds of the City shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of Idaho Code Sections 50-1019 through 50-1026, inclusive, and Title 57, Chapters 2 and 9, Idaho Code, in an amount not to exceed \$22,540,000 to pay the costs of the Project.

SECTION 2: SPECIAL ELECTION

A special municipal bond election is hereby called to be held within the City of Lewiston on Tuesday, November 4, 2025, for the purpose of voting upon the proposition set forth in Section 4 of this Ordinance. The polling place or places for the special bond election shall be determined by the Nez Perce County Clerk, and the election shall be conducted by the Nez Perce County Clerk. The Nez Perce County Clerk shall appoint election judges and election clerks for the polling place or places for the special bond election.

SECTION 3: ADMINISTRATION OF ELECTION

The polls of the special bond election shall open at the hour of 8:00 o'clock A.M. on November 4, 2025, and shall remain open continuously until the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., at which time the polls shall be closed. The administration of the election shall be conducted by Nez Perce County in accordance with Chapter 4 of Title 50, Idaho Code, Title 34 of Idaho Code, and this Ordinance.

The ballot proposition to be voted upon at the special bond election, as set forth in Section 4 of this Ordinance, shall be separate from any other proposition being voted upon at or in conjunction with any other election being held and conducted on the same date. Only those qualified electors of the City casting valid ballots upon the proposition set forth in Section 4 of this Ordinance shall be counted in determining the number of qualified electors voting at or participating in the special bond election.

SECTION 4: BALLOT PROPOSITION

The ballot proposition for the special bond election shall be in substantially the following form:

SHALL THE CITY OF LEWISTON BE AUTHORIZED TO INCUR INDEBTEDNESS AND SELL ITS GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$22,540,000 FOR CONSTRUCTING AND IMPROVING WASTEWATER, WATER, STORMWATER AND ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE, THE BONDS TO MATURE AND BE PAYABLE FROM A LEVY OF TAXES FOR A TERM WHICH SHALL NOT EXCEED THIRTY (30) YEARS?

If a full tax levy is needed to make the annual bond payment, the following disclosure will apply:

The anticipated interest rate on the proposed bonds is 3.75% per annum. The estimated annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed bond levy is a tax of \$30.47 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions.

The total principal amount to be repaid is \$22,540,000; the total interest to be paid is \$15,381,125; thus, the total amount proposed to be repaid over the life of the bonds is \$37,921,125.

Bonds proceeds will be used to construct wastewater, water, stormwater, and road improvements.

The City has outstanding indebtedness of \$24,755,360, payable only from sewer revenues and outstanding indebtedness of \$38,821,845, payable only from water revenues.

The City intends to use annual appropriations from: general funds, water, and sewer revenues to make bond payments and minimize or eliminate the need for a tax levy.

SECTION 5: QUALIFIED ELECTORS

Every person eighteen (18) years of age or older, who at the time of the specified bond election is a United States citizen who has been a legal and bona fide resident of the City for at least thirty (30) days immediately preceding the date of the election, if properly registered as required by law, shall be qualified to vote at said election.

All electors must be registered before being able to vote at the special bond election. The Nez Perce County Clerk is the registrar for the City, and voter registration shall be conducted pursuant to the provisions of Section 34-1402, Idaho Code.

Any person who is eligible to vote May register on election day by appearing in person at the polling place established for the election, by completing a registration card, making an oath on the form prescribed by law, and providing proof of residence in the manner provided by Section 34-408A, Idaho Code, as amended.

SECTION 6: BALLOTS

The Nez Perce County Clerk shall cause the official ballot for the special bond election to be prepared in a sufficient quantity for the special bond election.

SECTION 7: NOTICE

Notice of the special bond election shall be given by the Nez Perce County Clerk prior to the election by publishing notice of the election in the official newspaper of the City, the first publication being at least twelve (12) days prior to the election, the last publication to be not less than five (5) days prior to the special bond election. In accordance with Section 34-602, Idaho Code, as amended, the second publication of the notice of election shall be accompanied by a facsimile of the sample ballot for the special bond election.

SECTION 8: CANVASS

When the polls are closed, the election officials shall immediately proceed to count the ballots cast at the special bond election. The counting shall be continued without adjournment until completed and the result declared. The election judge and clerks shall thereupon certify the returns of the special bond election to the County Clerk, who shall present the results to the County Commissioners.

The Board of County Commissioners shall meet within ten (10) days following the election, or at such time to which said meeting is continued, for the purpose of canvassing the results of the special bond election. The County Clerk shall thereupon certify the election results to the City Clerk. The results shall then be entered into in the minutes of the City Council and proclaimed as final.

SECTION 9: DEBT DISCLOSURE STATEMENT

A brief official statement containing the information on outstanding debt shall be prepared by the City Clerk or Treasurer.

SECTION 10: GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

If, at the special bond election, two-thirds (2/3) of the qualified electors of the City voting therein vote in favor of the issuance of the bonds for the purposes set forth herein and designated on the aforesaid ballot, fully registered general obligation bonds of the City shall be authorized, issued, sold, and delivered. The full faith and credit of the City will be pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds. The bonds will be paid from annual taxes levied upon all taxable property within the City in sufficient amount to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof, together with the interest on the bonds as it falls due, for a term which may be less than but which shall not exceed thirty (30) years.

The officers now or hereafter charged by law with the duty of levying taxes for the payment of the bonds and interest thereon shall, in the manner provided by law, make annual levies upon all

taxable property within the City sufficient to meet the annual payments of bond principal and interest accruing and maturing as hereinabove provided.

All bonds shall be issued in the form and manner, and shall be registered, disposed of, and redeemed, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 50-1019 through 50-1026, Idaho Code, and Title 57, Chapters 2 and 9, Idaho Code.

SECTION 11: OFFICERS AUTHORIZED

The officers of the City and County are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 12: RATIFICATION

All action heretofore taken, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, by the Mayor and Council, and the officers of the City, directed toward acquisition of the Project and the issuance of general obligation bonds of the City therefor, and for the holding of a special bond election, are hereby ratified, approved, and confirmed.

SECTION 13: PUBLICATION

This Ordinance, or a summary thereof in compliance with Section 50-901A, Idaho Code, shall be published once in the official newspaper of the City, and shall take effect immediately upon its passage, approval, and publication.

SECTION 1: Ordinance No. 4923, the Annual Appropriation Ordinance of the City of Lewiston, Idaho for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025, is hereby amended as follows:

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 4950

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, TO BE TERMED THE “2026 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE,” APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY AUTHORIZED BY LAW AND DEEMED NECESSARY FOR ALL GENERAL AND SPECIAL MUNICIPAL PURPOSES OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, IDAHO, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2025 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2026; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Idaho Code § 50-1002, the City Council of the City of Lewiston, Idaho has prepared and tentatively approved an annual budget, including an estimate of total revenues anticipated and expenditures necessary for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026;

WHEREAS, pursuant to public notice, as required by law, a public hearing on the aforesaid proposed budget was held on August 11, 2025; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Idaho Code § 50-1003, the City of Lewiston is required to pass an annual appropriation ordinance prior to the commencement of the ensuing fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, IDAHO:

SECTION 1: This ordinance shall be known as the “2026 Annual Appropriation Ordinance.”

SECTION 2: The following sums of money, or as much thereof as may be authorized by law, needed or deemed necessary to defray all expenses and liabilities of the City of Lewiston, Idaho, are hereby appropriated for the general and special municipal and corporate purposes of the City of Lewiston as hereinafter specified for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON FIXING AND ESTABLISHING THE TAX CERTIFICATION ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTIES SITUATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2025 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2026, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING AND RAISING MONIES FOR MUNICIPAL AND CORPORATE PURPOSES; PROVIDING FOR THE TAX CERTIFICATION TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NEZ PERCE COUNTY, IDAHO IN THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY-FIVE MILLION FOUR THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$25,004,250); PROVIDING A CERTIFIED COPY OF THE 2026 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NEZ PERCE COUNTY, IDAHO, AS ADOPTED BY THE CITY OF LEWISTON FOR THE 2025-2026 FISCAL YEAR; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 4950, passed by the Lewiston City Council on August 25, 2025, the City of Lewiston, in the manner provided by law, adopted a budget and appropriated sums of money to defray expenses and liabilities of the City of Lewiston, Idaho for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026, for general and special municipal and corporate purposes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Idaho Code §§ 50-1007 and 63-803(3), not later than the Thursday prior to the second Monday in September of each year, the City Council is required to certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Nez Perce County, Idaho the total amount of money in dollars required to be raised from a property tax on property situated within the corporate limits of the City of Lewiston for all municipal and corporate purposes in accordance with and in order to raise the amount of money fixed by Ordinance No. 4950.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, IDAHO:

SECTION 1: A tax levy, or as much thereof as may be authorized by law, is hereby fixed and established in dollar amounts for the purpose of providing monies for general and special corporate purposes by which to meet and defray all expenses and liabilities of the City of Lewiston for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026, as authorized by Idaho Code §§ 50-

1007 and 63-803, in the amount of Twenty-Five Million Four Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$25,004,250).

In addition to the tax levy described above, the City of Lewiston anticipates receiving personal property tax replacement funds from the State of Idaho in the amount of Three Hundred Eighty-Three Thousand One Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$383,160).

SECTION 2: No later than September 4, 2025, the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Nez Perce County, Idaho the monies required to be raised from a property tax upon property situated within the corporate limits of the City of Lewiston in dollar amounts and for the purposes provided in Section 1 of this Ordinance, in order to raise the amount of money fixed by the budget and 2026 Annual Appropriation Ordinance (Ordinance No. 4950), passed by the Lewiston City Council on August 25, 2025.

SECTION 3: No later than September 4, 2025, the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Nez Perce County, Idaho a certified copy of the 2026 Annual Appropriation Ordinance (Ordinance No. 4950) adopted by the City Council of the City of Lewiston for the 2026 fiscal year, as required by Idaho Code §§ 50-1007 and 63-803.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication.
