

***April 13, 2026***

**T**HE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, IDAHO, met for a Regular Meeting in the Second Floor Activity Room of the Lewiston Library at 411 D Street. Mayor Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

**II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Mayor Johnson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**III. CITIZENS COMMENTS**

No comments were offered from citizens.

**IV. PRESENTATIONS**

Councilors Wright and Forsmann moved and seconded, respectively, to amend the agenda to read the Regence BlueShield 80th Proclamation. The motion carried 4-0.

**A. WEEK OF THE YOUNG CHILD PROCLAMATION:** Proclaiming April 13 - 17, 2026 as "Week of the Young Child" in the City of Lewiston (Mayor Johnson)

Mayor Johnson read the Week of the Young Child and presented it to IdahoSTARS and Regional Early Childhood Committee representatives Alicia Robertson, Darcy Peterson, and Abby Woolery,

Mayor Johnson then read the Regence BlueShield 80th Anniversary Proclamation, and presented it to Kathy Brumbaugh, Director, Provider Relations at Regence BlueShield of Idaho

Councilors Wright and Forsmann moved and seconded, respectively, to approve the first reading of Ordinance 4948. The motion carried 4-0.

**ORDINANCE 4948:** AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON AMENDING LEWISTON CITY CODE CHAPTER 19 RELATED TO HEALTH AND SANITATION AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### 2. **SECOND AND THIRD READINGS**

- a. **ORDINANCE 4958:** Considering amending Lewiston City Code Section 21-2 related to the definitions of vendors; Lewiston City Code Sections 21-66 and 21-69 related to the regulation of temporary vendors; Lewiston City Code Section 21-73 and Chapter 21, Article XI related to the regulation of mobile vendors; and amending Lewiston City Code Section 31-74 relating to temporary uses of the right-of-way by mobile vendors - Action Item (City Planner Joel Plaskon)

Councilors Forsmann and Wright moved and seconded, respectively, to waive the third reading in full of Ordinance 4958 and approve the third reading of Ordinance 4958 by title only. The motion carried 4-0.

Councilor Forsmann and Council President Kleeburg moved and seconded, respectively, to dispense with the requirement that an ordinance be read on three different days and to combine the second and third readings. The motion carried 4-0.

Councilors Forsmann and Wright moved and seconded, respectively, to waive the third reading in full of Ordinance 4961 and approve the reading of Ordinance 4961 by title only. The motion carried 4-0.

Councilor Forsmann questioned page 9 of 12 of Voucher's Payable under Travel for Tyler Connect - Tyler Technologies. City Treasurer/Finance Director Gordon explained that Tyler Technologies is the software used to handle payroll, budget, finance, etc. While they don't go every year, she and another employee attended the training this year.

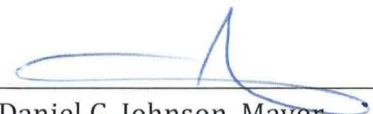
**D. AGENDA TOPICS:** - Action Item
